

INFLATION MONITOR MAY 2024

A simplified version of inflation data tailored for trade union negotiators.



Inflation is a sustained rise in the general level of prices of goods and services. It is measured as an annual percentage increase (e.g., May 2023 to May 2024). A falling rate of inflation means that prices are rising more slowly.

The inflation rate stayed at 5.2% in May 2024, the same as in April 2024. The Consumer Price Index (CPI) went up by 0.2% from April to May 2024.

Food prices dropped slightly to 4.3% in May from 4.4% in April. Transport costs increased to 6.3% in May from 5.7% in April. Public transport prices rose to 2% in May from -0.6% in April. Administrator's prices went up a bit to 8.9% in May from 8.8% in April.




Figure 1: Consumer Price Index (CPI) and selected price categories | June 2022 to May 2024


Statistics South Africa divides monthly household expenditure into 10 deciles. Expenditure in decile 10 was higher than expenditure in decile 1, indicating extreme inequality.

There is more than one inflation rate. Different groups can experience different rates of inflation because they buy different things. The lowest spending group (decile 1) experienced an inflation rate of 6.1%, which was higher than the headline annual inflation rate of 5.2%. The highest spending group (decile 10) had an inflation rate of 5.5%, slightly above the headline rate by 0.3%.

Limpopo (4.2%), Mpumalanga (5%), Free State (5.1%), Gauteng (5.1%), KwaZulu-Natal (5.1%), Gauteng (5.1%), Northwest (5.2%) and Northern Cape (5.2%) were the provinces

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with annual inflation rates lower than or equal to the headline rate. Eastern Cape (5.3%) and Western Cape (5.7%) were the provinces with annual inflation higher than headline inflation.

The consumer price index is known as the headline inflation rate and is also called the official inflation rate. The monthly prices of over a thousand goods and services are used to calculate the CPI.

The transport price index measures the increase in the price level of transport items in the basket of goods and services that make up the inflation index. It is included in overall CPI inflation.

Table 8: The Administered Price Index

An administered price: The price of a product deliberately fixed by a single producer or group of producers and/or any price that may be determined or influenced by the government, either directly or through one or more government agencies/institutions, without reference to market forces. Examples include school fees, telephone charges, electricity, trains, petrol/paraffin, mobile phone calls and public transport. This rate is part of the overall CPI inflation rate.

The June 2024 CPI data is expected on 24 July 2024

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
