## **Median increases by industry**

Agriculture, hunting, forestry, and fishing recorded the highest percentage increase in median wages in Q2 of 2024, at 8.5%.

## Wage increases for January to July 2024

Bargaining Councils negotiated wage increases ranging from 4% to 8%, with a median increase of 6%, against a headline inflation rate of 5.1%
